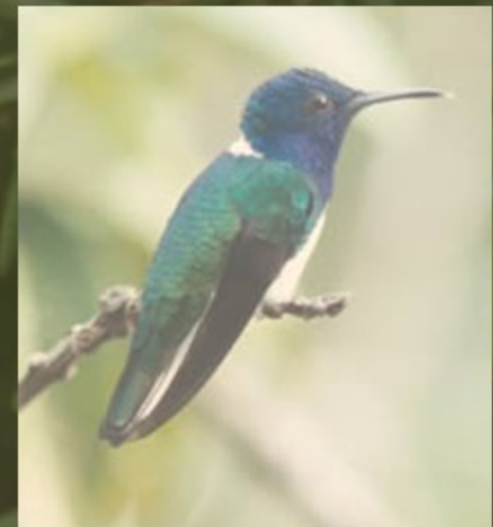
TRAVELING MAN & RESEARCHER

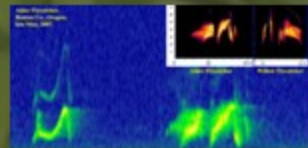


TEACHER
